

This year's Commonwealth Games is about more than just sport. The excitement of a \$105 million ceremony venue and the arrival of 6600 athletes from 70 Commonwealth nations and territories aside, the integration of paracompetition into the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games is a profound step towards equality and inclusion in the Games. Perhaps as a result of their popularity at Glasgow in 2014, the Gold Coast Commonwealth Games will host the largest para-sporting programme in history, with up to 300 parasport athletes and 38 medal events across seven sports.

Similarly, an equal number of men's and women's events across all seven para-sports highlights this year's commitment to equality and inclusion. This ambitious decision to make the Games more accessible for everybody will hopefully become an engrained tradition of the Commonwealth games.







